


## Thornton-in-Craven Community Primary and Nursery School

Dear prospective parent,

Thank you for your interest in a nursery place for your child at our school. We are currently taking applications for places from September 2019. We hope that the information provided will encourage you to complete an application form. For a September 2019 start we are accepting applications until Thursday June 20th 2019 and places will then be allocated on Friday 21st June. After this date, remaining nursery places will be filled on a first come first served basis until all the places are filled. The number of nursery places available for 2019-20 is 10 places and we anticipate that we will be able to accommodate all applications received. However, in the event that there are more applications than places then these will be allocated as per the North Yorkshire admissions criteria.

## Priority is as follows:

- 1 Looked after children and all previously looked after children for whom the school has been expressed as a preference.
- 2 Children the considered to have special social or medical reasons for admission.

We will only consider applications on social or medical grounds if they are supported by a professional recommendation from a doctor, social worker, or other appropriate professional. The supporting evidence should set out the particular social or medical reason(s) why the school in question is the most suitable school and the difficulties that would be caused if the child had to attend another school.

3 Children living within the normal area of the school.

If the nursery is oversubscribed, priority will be given to a sibling of a pupil at the school in the September of the younger sibling's entry, and then to those living nearest the school.

4 Children living outside the normal area of the school.

If a school is oversubscribed, priority will be given to a sibling of a pupil at the school in the September of the younger sibling's entry, and then to those living nearest the school.
