**Class 1**

In numeracy this week we have looked at capacity and have enjoyed the practical element. We have used a range of terminology to measure liquid and have used non-standard measures to full up different sized containers. We are now ready to measure using ml and l. In Literacy we are completing non-fiction writing. We have looked at non-fiction books to identify the features. We have then wrote non-fiction sentences about two types of dinosaurs ready to create our own dinosaur book. In Science we have labelled the parts of a plant and their functions, we have also started to grow our own bean plants. In topic we completed a fact sheet to explain why Mary Anning is significant. We finished off our dinosaur collages creating the background for these. In RE we looked at different foods Jewish people could and couldn't eat.

**Class 2**

Year 4 have been partitioning amounts of money and writing money in its decimal form. We were very good at counting amounts of money. Year 2 and 3 have been measuring in standard units of length and weight and learning how the different measures relate to each other. In literacy, we began looking at Shape Poems and really enjoyed looking at 'Bembo's Zoo' - an alphabet of animal calligrams. We discussed why they made good poems and practiced making our own. In topic work this week, we looked at what makes a good sport's coach. The children made a paper coach and labelled it with good qualities. They also looked on the flip-side as to what qualities they would not want to see in a coach! In music, we learnt a rap when continuing our learning about beat and rhythm. The children were performing it with 'attitude' which was super to see!

**Class 3**

We have been entrepreneurs this week, working together to come up with ideas for our stalls for tomorrow's summer fayre. We have considered the best possible profit and thought about our target market. We have then worked together to get all produce and ideas together ready for the fayre. Please come along and support us. We have also been working really hard rehearsing for our class play. We performed it today for Y2/3 (who will be swimming on Monday during the dress rehearsal) and it went really well so we are hopeful for a fantastic production on Monday. A reminder that there is a dress rehearsal at 1.30pm and the main production at 6.30pm - families welcome to both productions (though could smaller children attend the dress rehearsal if possible pls).

**This week in After-School club:**
